Have you checked out our [Kanopy](#) video collection lately? This database of streaming videos provides access to 26,000 videos from leading film and documentary producers. Even if you have used a Kanopy film in the past you may not be aware of their specialized collections such as Immigrant Stories, Race and Class Studies, Spanish Language Cinema, or collections created for special events like Native American Heritage Month.

The videos can be linked to your Canvas page as assignments or shown in class. You may also customize your own collection by combining clips or full films into a playlist.

The [USFSP Nelson Poynter Memorial Library's YouTube Channel](#) features how-to videos on demonstrating research skills and resources with playlists such as APA Citation Style, RefWorks, Designing Research Posters, Faculty Lightning Talks, and much more. 
