Digital Archive

What's In It for USFSP Students : How Do Students Benefit by Using the USFSP Digital Archive for your Papers and Presentations?

The Digital Archive provides:

- A unique and never-changing URL that they can cite and link to their work anytime and anywhere that there is access to the Internet
- Full-text indexing of the papers or presentations
- A [Creative Commons](#) license that protects their copyright and tells the world that the work is theirs
- A date and time stamp so they can document when they did the work
- Indexing by Google, Google Scholar, and other services so that their work can be found by anyone searching the Internet
- Use statistics so they can see how many people have looked at your work and where they are located
- Key words or subject terms that they can select to help describe their work
