**JUVENILE WELFARE BOARD OF PINELLAS COUNTY**  
First Public TRIM Hearing of 1991  
August 22, 1991

PRESENT: Frank B. Diamond, Jr., M.D., Chair; Thomas R. Moriarty, Vice Chair; Charles A. Felton, Secretary; Dr. Howard Hinesley; Judge Jack A. Page; Commissioner George Greer; Arlene Diaco; James E. Mills, Executive Director; and Amy Daly, Executive Assistant

Dr. Diamond called the meeting to order at 5:35 p.m.

Following opening remarks by Mr. Mills, and Ms. Judd, Director of Programs and Finance, the following individuals spoke on behalf of Florida Gulf Coast Autism Association and their interest in maintaining funding for this program: Theresa Halloran, 1304 Withlacoochee Street, Safety Harbor; Bill Sandomato, 1856 Barcelona Drive, Dunedin; Ira Funderbuck, 1130 Withlacoochee Street, Safety Harbor; Marie Brown, 10519 98 Street North, Largo; Debbie Hayes, 7292-81 Terrace North, Pinellas Park. In response to a question from Dr. Diamond, Mr. Mills indicated that the FGCAA would be able to apply for additional funding.

Mr. Mills also distributed a folder of 24 letters received from parents who supported the efforts of the Florida Gulf Coast Autism Association and the funding provided by JWB and a folder of two letters from individuals who expressed concern over the increased millage.

Approval of Tentative  
Millage Rate

Commissioner Greer moved and Ms. Diaco seconded a motion which carried unanimously to adopt the following resolution:

Be it hereby resolved, the Juvenile Welfare Board of Pinellas County, in order to provide to or in behalf of children, services which the Board has determined are needed for the general welfare of the County, tentatively adopts a millage rate of .5592, which is a 19.9% increase in property taxes.

**MOTION**  
Approval of Tentative  
Budget

Mr. Felton moved and Commissioner Greer seconded a motion which carried unanimously to adopt the following resolution:

Be it hereby resolved, the Juvenile Welfare Board of Pinellas County, in order to provide, to or in behalf of children, services which the Board has determined are needed for the general welfare of the County, tentatively adopts a budget of \$18,942,632.
