Mr. Moriarty called the meeting to order at 5:55 p.m.

Written response was made to seven questions that had been posed by the Board at the February 4, 1993 workshop:

1. What is the cost of building a new building that would house JWB administrative staff only?
2. What is the cost of building a new building that would house JWB administration, Coordinated Child Care, Marriage and Family Counseling and the Pinellas County License Board.
3. What are rental costs for JWB administration; Marriage and Family Counseling, the Training Center (with the library and without the library)?
4. What are the costs of constructing a facility on adjacent property (41st Avenue and 49th Street North) that would house the library, conference rooms and/or Marriage and Family Counseling?
5. What is the possibility of building a facility on Pinellas County School Board property?
6. What are the fiscal projections?
7. What is the cost of essential renovations to the existing building?

A budget that included renovations to the existing space, addition of a second story, site work, additional parking spaces, the recommended contingency and architect's fees was also provided to the Board.

Following questions and comment from the Board, it was suggested that a workshop be convened for those Board members who were unable to attend the March 15 workshop so response to their questions and concerns may be answered. It was then suggested that another workshop be held for all Board members prior to any formal building expansion recommendations being made. Board members asked that staff respond to the following:

1. Articulate the need for alleviating the present space problems.
2. Provide a detailed plan for building a new training facility on the corner of 41st Avenue and 49th Street North, including the possibility of adding a second story.

The workshop adjourned at 7:32 p.m.
