MINUTES

**Present:** Frank B. Diamond, Chair; Thomas R. Moriarty, Vice Chair; Charles A. Felton, Secretary; Commissioner George Greer; Arlene Diaco; Jacquelynne Jones; James E. Mills, Executive Director; JWB Staff

Dr. Diamond called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m. This is the second workshop convened to address the 5-year implementation plan for the expenditure of the increased revenue realized as a result of JWB's increased taxing authority from .5 to 1.0 mill. This workshop dealt with organization and staff issues for the first year and beyond.

For Year One these issues included:

Pressures on existing building and parking space at JWB with the need to develop long-range space plans.

Staffing considerations including the incorporation of the substance abuse position from project funding to the regular budget; the addition of one contract manager and one fiscal analyst; funding of the previously approved position of Community Planning and Development Manager; the addition of one or more additional administrative support positions; and expanded Community Relations capability.

For Year 2 and beyond the Board discussed the current structure of YSAC; the role of training and demands made upon the Training Center; JWB's research capability; JWB's relationship to system and individual advocacy; consumer involvement in the planning, organization, delivery and evaluation of services; and expanding JWB's capability to engage foundations and venture capital.

The Board suggested that current YSAC members offer input as to restructuring YSAC. The Board would like more interaction with YSAC committees. The Board would also like a better opportunity to participate in program site visits. Ms. Judd offered to develop a process for these visits so that schedules from the Board could be better accommodated. Board also expressed an interest in JWB offering continuing education credits for JWB training participants and an interest in the development of a curriculum for juvenile justice and drug treatment, research coordination and improved foundation capabilities.

The decision was made to discuss the need to improve JWB's community organization and community planning capabilities at a future workshop.

The workshop adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
