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
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FRESHMEN EXPLORE NEW INTERESTS VIA COMPASS 'LEARNING JOURNEYS'

The experience was part of a 3-D printing workshop—one of several "Learning Journeys" USFSP's Compass First-Year Experience is offering this semester to promote academic engagement.

"I just wanted to go out with my roommate and explore what 3-D printing is all about," said Lynnsey Trantham, 18, a health sciences freshman who attended. Trantham, who serves as a peer coach for Compass, joined the class in designing custom keychains. "Learning Journeys help you to discover something you likely wouldn't learn in your regular classes."

3-D printing is a hobby for Varol Kayhan, associate professor of information systems and decision sciences in the Kate Tiedemann College of Business. Kayhan taught the one-hour workshop for the second time as part of Compass to share that passion with students.

USFSP students are invited to participate in the Learning Journeys as a way to promote academic engagement opportunities and to help them build personal connections with faculty.


